DEVELOPMENT HISTORY

- **National Corruption Tribunal (NCT)**

- Inaugurated on 18 November 1988
- National President – Garth William Eaton
- Wholly ceased in 1996
- NCT bank account at CBA, Queen Street, Brisbane was closed in 1997

- Queensland's Justice Minister, Paul Clauson, placed a notice in *The Courier-Mail* on 24 January 1989 claiming that NCT advertisements taken out in *The Courier-Mail* were not sanctioned by the Government.

The fact remains to this day that the NCT **did not** need the sanction (i.e. authoritative permission) of the State Government, nor any other government – State or Federal – for that matter; and nor did the NCT ever hold out that its advertisements were sanctioned by any government.

- **The Australian Justice Tribunal (The AJT)**

- Drafting of the National Constitution began October 2004
- Inaugurated 31 December 2005
- National President – Garth William Eaton (31.12.2005 to 3.5.2011)
- Chairman – Garth William Eaton (The AJT was incorporated – 3.5.2011)

- The National Constitution of The Australian Justice Tribunal (The AJT) was lodged with the Westpac Banking Corporation (Westpac) on 12 January 2006 at the time of opening the Organisation's "Society Cheque Account"; a title that was changed to "Community Solutions Cheque Account" on 10 February 2006.

- Associates of the Chairman have continued to volunteer their assistance since the commencement of drafting the National Constitution in 2004.

- The AJT's Voluntary Workers and Public Liability insurances through QBE Commercial were taken out on 16 November 2007 and cancelled 23 November 2009 – Temporarily not required.
- The AJT was approved by Centrelink to host Volunteers through the Department of Employment and Workplace Relations (DEWR – now DEEWR) on 16 November 2007 – Ceased registration with Centrelink on 23 November 2009 when insurances were voluntarily cancelled.
- The AJT was registered with Volunteering North Queensland (VNQ) on 16 November 2007 – Ceased registration on 10 December 2009.
- The AJT became an Associate Member of VNQ on 19 March 2008 – Ceased membership on 10 December 2009.
- **www.TheAJT.org** was activated on Australia Day, 26 January 2010. The domain names www.TheAustralianJusticeTribunal.org and www.AustralianJusticeTribunal.org were forwarded to www.TheAJT.org.
- The Chairman of The Australian Justice Tribunal commenced writing his autobiography, *Beneath The Bench*, in July 2006, completing it in 2009. One purpose of this eBook is to emphasise the absolute need for The Australian Justice Tribunal's Pro Bono (free) legal services.
- **www.BeneathTheBench.com** was activated on Australia Day, 26 January 2010.
- **www.gartheaton.com** was activated in January **2003**, and modified on 26 January 2010 and 17 April 2011 partly to direct visitors to www.BeneathTheBench.com and www.TheAJT.org (subsequently www.TheAJT.org.au – the post incorporation domain name for The AJT).
- The Australian Justice Tribunal [ABN: 53 150 698 516] was registered (incorporated) as a not-for-profit, special purpose public company limited by guarantee on 3 May 2011.
- The National Constitution of The Australian Justice Tribunal was lodged with the Westpac Banking Corporation (Westpac) at 360 Collins Street, Melbourne, Victoria on 31 May 2011 at the time of opening the Company's "Community Solutions Cheque Account".
- The Australian Justice Tribunal's applications for endorsement as a Tax Concession Charity (TCC) and Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR) were approved by the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) on 29 July 2011. The ATO now recognises this company as a **Public Benevolent Institution** as at 6 May 2011, being the date of those applications.
- **Central AJT Pty Ltd**, a wholly owned subsidiary of The Australian Justice Tribunal, opened its bank account with the Westpac Banking Corporation (Westpac) at 360 Collins Street, Melbourne, Victoria on 29 July 2011.

After six and a half years of research & development which has been underpinned by the Chairman's 23-year history of selectively challenging the unlawful conduct of government agencies, the inadequacies of the Australian legal system, and personally witnessing the post traumatic stress disorder suffered by Australians who have been denied Natural Justice, The Australian Justice Tribunal now stands ready to offer its Pro Bono legal assistance to all Australians (qualified) in genuine need of our services – 29 July 2011.
